Reading: The students read a historical fiction play in class to wrap up our historical fiction unit. They worked on their final Who was/What was group presentations and will share those with their classmates on Monday. We start science fiction next week!

Writing: Students continued to practice writing with dialogue. They will have a quiz on Tuesday to show they can properly use dialogue in stories.

English: Miss Esquivel began teaching English this week. She taught demonstratives, comparative and superlative adjectives.

Religion: Students have been busy brainstorming ideas for our door display!

Social Studies:

Students took a political map of South America and turned it into a physical map of the continent. They will be creating a class Google Slides presentation over the different landforms next week to share with the class. We are also slowly getting through all of our Native American presentations. We only present two or three during Social Studies time.

Science: Students created a food web from an ecosystem of their choice. They needed to show they knew the following terms: producer, primary, secondary, and tertiary consumer. They also needed to properly show the path of energy. Next week we will be discussing more in depth the energy pyramid and then they will have a short quiz over the two sections.

Math: Students finished the first division unit and will be moving to the second division unit with two-digit divisors. This can be a very tricky concept so we will be doing lots of practice in class and outside of class.
