#### Parent Information

#### MAP Testing:

Students will begin MAP testing next week. We will be testing every Tuesday from 12:25 until about 2:00. Please let me know if your child will be out of the building during this time.

#### Spelling Test:

Students took their first spelling test this week. Students keep their spelling words in a tan folder in their homework folder to study each night. If you need a copy of the list, this is available on my website under the spelling tab.

## What we are learning...

Reading: We jumped right into curriculum by starting our read aloud book, <u>Holes</u> by Louis Sachar. The genre focus is Realistic Fiction. We focused on vocabulary and unknown words while reading. We also learned about flashbacks, which is very important to this story! We set up our reading notebook and binder. Most importantly we are working on building reading stamina so we can read for extended periods of time!

Writing: Students are working on their first writing piece about their superpowers. They completed the prewriting stage by brainstorming ideas and then started drafting their first three body paragraphs. Eventually the students will have a five paragraph essay that we will display in the hallway.

English: The students started learning about the four types of sentences. Ask your child to tell you the difference between interrogative, imperative, declarative, and exclamatory sentence. This year we will be doing a mini lesson a day and then continuing to use these skills in our daily writing.

Religion: Students began reading about the sacraments. These first two quarters we will be learning about each sacrament in depth.

Science: With new science standards for the state and the diocese, we started our first unit on matter. Students had a strong understanding of solids, liquids, and gases. We will be building upon what they already know by completing a number of science experiments. Ask your child to tell you about them!

I will be sending out a newsletter every other week this year. I will periodically send email updates on the off weeks.
