Edition 7 WRITING: STUDENTS ARE ENJOYING OUR PERSUASIVE UNIT IN WRITING. THIS WEEK WE BRAINSTORMED IDEAS TO WRITE ABOUT AND DISCUSSED THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN UNDISPUTABLE FACTS AND ARGUABLE CLAIMS. STUDENTS PICKED TWO TOPICS THEY WERE PASSIONATE ABOUT AND COME UP WITH A LIST OF REASONS FOR THE SPECIFIC ISSUE AND REASONS AGAINST THE ISSUE THEN STUDENTS STARTED TO DRAFT TWO DIFFERENT PERSUASIVE ESSAYS. ON FRIDAY, THEY PICKED THEIR FAVORITE OUT OF THE TWO DRAFTS AND WILL BE USING THAT TOPIC THE REST OF THE MONTH TO WRITE A STRONG PERSUASIVE PIECE. ONCE WE ARE DONE WRITING OUR PIECES, WE WILL BE HOLDING A CLASSROOM DEBATE
