## What we are fearning.

Reading: Students are finishing up their historical fiction unit from before Christmas break. Each student was given a "Who was" or "What was" book that corresponds with their historical fiction novel. They are reading them independently and taking notes. They will be working with their literature circle groups to create a Powerpoint to teach the class a little about their book and the real people, places, and events described in the book.

Writing: Students will continue to work with dialogue as we need a little bit more practice before finalizing our personal narratives. Ms. Esquivel will then teach the persuasive essay unit!

English: Students took their English verb test and will start the adjectives unit next. They are also practicing diagramming sentences each day, along with finding errors in their editing packet. We are starting to understand how the parts of speech work together.

Religion: Students are beginning to study the next sacrament of Confirmation. We are currently reading out of the book and will be completing a few activities!

Social Studies: Students are now familiar with the Central America countries. They are also presenting their Native American Presentations. Next week they will also have time to work on finding some of the physical features of South America and labeling them on a map.

Science: We are working through our Life Science unit by reviewing food chains and food webs. We will be working through mysteryscience.com for the next few weeks.

Math: Ms. Esquivel will be starting to teach math next week! She will be teaching the students about prime and composite numbers, greatest common factor, least common multiple, and reviewing for our chapter 4 test. She will be working with small groups on working through story problem skills and strategies.
